As I was going through our 'stuff', trying to decide what to keep and what to throw away, I came upon a very small cassette. My wife had just found the special player for it, so I listened to it. I heard the sound of my little boy reading a book (he must have been in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade). My little boy will be 35 in July. It was amazing. And I thought, it hasn't been that long that people have been able to record and play back what things sound like. And the technology keeps changing. If we had not found the player for that mini-cassette, we would never have been able to listen to it. So, what has been the history of sound recording? The phonograph was invented in 1877. But it was a toy of the rich and it was not a very faithful reproduction of sound. In the 1920's wire recording was invented. It was very expensive. By the end of World War II it was coming down in price and became more popular. By this time the phonograph technology had moved on to vinyl recordings (from the earlier wax covered tubes). So anyone with the earlier tubes could not play them unless they could find a player in working condition. The tape recorder was becoming popular at the end of the war also. It slowly replaced the wire recorder and the wire recorder industry died by the early 1950's. No more wire machines, no ability to play old recordings. The tape recorder went through several media changes. The first ones were large reel to reel recorders, still very expensive. 10 1/2 inch reels that held 2400 feet of tape that could record for 2 to 8 hours (longer recordings were less quality). But sound recording was still not available to the masses. Tape went from reel to reel to the 8 track. Then the compact cassette was invented around 1963. By 1979 it had become popular and inexpensive and anyone could buy a recorder. Then people were recording all the sounds in their world. So the consumer reel to reel industry died. Today people record with computers and cd's and phones and it is compact cassettes that are out of date. I am going to transfer my recordings to more modern media to preserve my memories. But my mom can only rely on her memories for how I sounded as a child. The times, they are a changing.
