Pastor Jack has asked me to teach you something about the U.S. Presidential Election. First off, let me tell you that the United States is NOT a democracy. It is a Republic. What does that mean? In a true Democracy every voter would have a right and responsibility to vote on each and every law that is passed by the government. In a Republic, the eligible citizens elect representatives to vote on these matters for them. This is how we do it in the United States. The people who wrote the constitution were afraid of a democracy because, in their experience, democracies "have ever been found incompatible with personal security and the rights of property; and have in general been as short in their lives as they have been violent in their deaths." However, today people use the word democracy to mean that the government derives its power from the people, and that is what we have in the United States. In the presidential elections we generally have two elections. A primary election to choose the few people who will be the candidates voted on in the general election which chooses the president. Many people may run for president, but we only vote on a few in the general election. When we vote in the general election we cast a vote for our choice, but our vote is only counted to see who wins in our state. Each state has members of the Electoral College whom they send as representatives to vote for the president. Each state has Electoral College members equal to the number of Representatives plus two for the number of Senators the state has. In all but two of the states, whoever wins in the state gets all of the Electoral College members from that state. Those Electoral College members are pledged to vote for the winner of the state. When the final count is taken, the candidate must have 270 of the 538 Electoral College votes to become the President of the United States. This means that if you are in favor of a particular candidate, you need to vote because it only takes ONE vote to win all the Electoral College votes in a state. That is, the winner need only have one vote more than the loser! So, if a particular candidate would be a better representative of your view of government, you need to vote to make sure he is elected. Unfortunately, less than 60% of eligible voters vote in the presidential elections. So, if you are eligible to vote, VOTE and make a difference on who is the leader of our country!
